Labor Market Information Center

Preface

The Child Care and Development Fund, administered through the Division of Child Care Services (CCS), is designed to improve the quality, affordability, and accessibility of child care in South Dakota. Every two years a new plan must be developed and submitted to the Administration for Children and Families in Washington D.C. for approval.

The Division of Child Care Services, in cooperation with the Labor Market Information Center, has conducted a biennial child care market rate survey as part of the planning process. The data gathered in this survey is used to determine the current child care rates in South Dakota. These rates are used as a basis in determining the amount of assistance which can be provided to families eligible for various child care programs administered by the Department of Social Services.

Through the cooperation and assistance of South Dakota's child care providers, fair and equitable reimbursement rates for child care can be established. Additionally, the accessibility of quality child care for all families in South Dakota is improved.

METHODOLOGY

Survey Instruments

Survey questionnaires were developed by the Division of Child Care Services (CCS) to obtain current information on child care in South Dakota. A questionnaire was developed for each of the following provider types: Family Day Cares, Child Care Centers and Group Family Day Cares (combined) and Before and After School Programs (or OST's). The surveys were designed to collect rate data as well as data on other fees, services provided, enrollment, days and hours of operation, preschool availability, vacancies and waiting lists.

The survey questionnaires were mailed by CCS to child care providers and were accompanied by postage-paid return envelopes. Subsequently, a second survey was sent by CCS to all non-respondents. It is important to note that participation in the survey was voluntary.

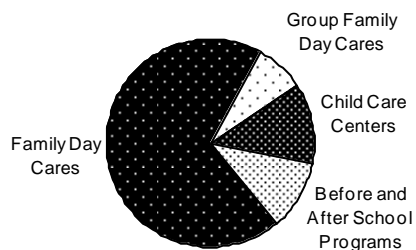
Study Population

An electronic list of child care providers and their contact information was provided by the South Dakota Department of Social Services, Division of Child Care Services. The list included all registered and licensed child care providers in South Dakota. Of the 1432 providers surveyed, 1004 are Family Day Cares, 180 are Child Care Centers, 85 are Group Family Day Cares, and 163 are Before and After School Programs. Unlicensed providers and relatives are not included in this study.

Response

Of the child care providers surveyed, 993 active providers completed the survey resulting in a 70 percent response rate. This total is inclusive of 687 Family Day Cares, 148 Child Care Centers, 61 Group Family Day Cares, and 97 Before and After School Programs (see page 22).

Response by Provider Type



Twenty-eight (2%) respondents reported that they weren't providing child care at the time of the survey, and 40 (2.8%) providers reported that they were out of business.

Software

The data obtained from the survey was analyzed using Access 2002 and SPSS 16.0 software. Data entry and reports were performed in Access; rate tables were generated using SPSS. For emailing purposes, the Access reports were exported to a snapshot format, and the SPSS files were exported to an excel format. Preliminary data was then compiled in Adobe Acrobat and provided to DSS via email.

Weighting

Rates, except drop-ins, were weighted by enrollment to account for the actual number of child care slots rather than the number of child care providers. Using this methodology, a provider caring for 50 children would carry a greater representation in the results than a provider caring for 5 children.

Geographic Areas

Providers in certain locations, particularly urban areas, tend to charge significantly higher child care rates in comparison to the rest of South Dakota. Therefore, separate market rates have been calculated for each county to reflect varying prices for child care.

Provider Types

Rates were collected from four types of providers:

- Group Family Day Cares
- Family Day Cares
- Child Care Centers
- Before and After School Programs

Market rates were collected and calculated for Centers and Group Family Day Cares combined. Separate rates were calculated for Family Day Cares and for Before and After School Programs.

Age Groups

Rates and enrollment were collected for the following age groups:

- Infant/Toddler (4 weeks to 2 years)
- Pre-school (3 to 5 years)
- School age (6 years and older)

For the first time, rates for the infant and toddler age groups were collected *and* calculated in a single group for statistical purposes. Rates for the preschool and school age groups were kept separate, as they were for the first time in the previous survey in 2007.

Rate Calculations

Child care market rates were calculated at the 75th percentile, meaning *75 percent of the child care slots reported are charged rates at or below this level.*

Family Day Cares, Day Care Centers and Group Family Day Cares

Providers reported rate information on an hourly, daily, weekly, or monthly basis. See Report 0003 on page 20 for a detailed analysis of how South Dakota's providers charge.

The following methodology was used to bring reported rates to an hourly level:

Providers were asked to report the average number of hours per week that full time children spend at their facility. This figure was then used to convert respondents' full time daily, weekly, or monthly rate to an hourly rate.

These converted rates were then grouped with all reported full- and part-time *hourly* rates to complete the data set to be used for analysis.

Weekly rates were also calculated for each provider category. These rates were based *only* on those providers/rates that were reported on a weekly basis.

For the first time, drop-in rates and special needs rates were not collected or calculated.

Before and After School Programs

Separate rates were calculated for Before and After School programs since they are unique in nature. These providers were asked to provide rate information for before school care, after school care, before *and* after school care, summertime care, and full-day care for holidays, in-service days, etc. Providers were also asked to report the average number of hours per week that children are present during each particular time slot. This figure was then used to convert each respondent's flat rates to an hourly rate.

Specialized Infant-Toddler Provider Rates

As a way to encourage smaller group sizes, family day care providers who choose to care for infants and toddlers *and* limit the total number of children in care to six or less, may receive a higher reimbursement rate. This special "infant" rate is 25 percent higher than the average family day care rates established by the most recent market rate survey and applies to children up to age 3. The provider must inform their Licensing Specialist so the registration certificate may be adjusted to reflect the reduced number of children.

Special Needs Rates

Rates paid to child care providers caring for children with special needs were determined by increasing the current rate of \$3.90 per hour by the average increase in all rates statewide which is 5.57%. See page 6 for the new rate and additional information.

Unregulated Provider Rates

Unregulated provider rates are established at 75% of the statewide average established by the most recent market rate survey for regulated family child care providers.

Weekly Provider Rates

Rates were calculated for providers who indicated they charge a flat weekly rate . This information will be used to determine maximum allowable rates paid to providers who charge a weekly rate. For weekly rates by provider type, see pages 7 and 8.

Other Information Submitted to CCS Electronically

Other information, not included in this report, was compiled by the Labor Market Information Center and provided electronically to the Division of Child Care Services.

Email Addresses: Respondents were asked to provide their email addresses on the returned questionnaires. These were compiled and emailed to CCS in an Excel format.

List of Providers Requesting a Copy of Results: Providers were able to indicate if they were interested in receiving a copy of the results of the survey. A list of names and addresses of those showing interest were provided to CCS in an Excel format.

\$2.50 birth to age 3*

Established county rate for age 3 and older

Special Needs Rate (all counties)

\$4.10 all ages

Unregulated Provider Rate (all counties)

\$1.50 all ages

Regulated Providers are licensed or registered with the state. They include family child care, group family child care, child care centers and out-of-school time programs.

Unregulated Providers include the following:

Relative Provider: must be an aunt/uncle, grandparent or great-grandparent and can reside in the child's home. A sibling of the child may also provide care but must maintain a separate residence.

In-Home Provider: provides care in the family's home and cares only for the children of that family.

Informal Care Provider: a family friend or neighbor who provides care only for the children of one family including the provider's own children.
