Abbott House has an orientation checklist that is used as an orientation plan and to document completion of the orientation by new staff. A Staff Training 9/2019-8/2020 schedule was submitted with the application materials which outline the agency's new staff orientation and what is included in the orientation for staff in the first 30 days of employment as well as for staff in the first twelve months of employment and staff who have been employed for more than twelve months. Each record reviewed for a staff member employed during the past year contained documentation to verify they completed the agency orientation during their first month of employment and documentation was found showing the orientation meets requirements of ARSD 67:42:07:04.

The Training 9/2019-8/2020 document details training required for staff each year including mandatory trainings. The training outline states all staff is required to attend forty hours of training

per year and that a structured training format is imposed to provide elements of training required and that the agency expects employees to engage in self-study.

The training document outlines the training required for hourly and salaried staff. The document states hourly staff will receive on the spot real time competency based training on a weekly basis by the employees supervisor and salaried staff will be assigned one competency based training to address an area of weakness or need for improvement in job performance which is to be completed prior to the next annual performance review.

Abbott House uses Relias Learning, an internet-based staff training and development program for annual staff trainings. Personnel records reviewed for staff employed for more than one year contained documentation of at least 40 hours of in-service training during the past year.
