### Comments:

An Arise East 2019 In-Service Training Schedule was included in the application materials and appears to be in compliance with licensing rules. The training schedule provides for 74.5 hours of in-service training which is coded 1 through 11 and appears to be in compliance with licensing rules.

Documentation to verify compliance with the above requirements was found in each of the records except the reviewers found compliance issues with the initial orientation to the program in several personnel records. Compliance issues included one record where the orientation was not completed until three months after the hire date, in two files the orientation appeared to be completed within the time allotted however it was not signed off for until several months after the hire date, one was not signed, and one record did not have documentation of orientation. Similar issues were noted during the previous license renewal. Please submit a plan within 30 days which assures all new employees complete an orientation course within one month after their hire date to be in compliance with ARSD 67:42:07:04.

Please update your policy within 30 days to be in compliance with ARSD 67:42:07:16.

It is recommended that a satisfactory license be issued to Lutheran Social Services to operate the Arise Youth Center/East as a Group Care Center for Minors-Shelter Care Facility at 621 E Presentation Street in Sioux Falls, SD, to provide care for a maximum of 15 youth age ten to seventeen years.
