All staff interviewed indicated they are familiar with the circumstances under which it is appropriate to use an ESI and that use of restraint and seclusion is part of the facility's in-service training. Staff interviewed was able to provide a general understanding of the process for use of ESI's as well as all agency policy and procedures for use of ESI's. Staff interviewed indicated the facility uses restraint as a last resort.
