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## Meth Awareness Campaign

- “Meth Changes Everything”
  - Educate high school students and community members on the dangers of methamphetamine use
  - Prevention providers presenting videos and information at various high schools and conducting community town hall meetings
    - 164 school presentations; 21 community meetings
    - Over 6,500 participants
  - Website and social media campaign
    - Website - <http://methchangeseverything.com/>
      - 2,412 individuals have take the pledge; 12,318 visits with over 20,000 page views
    - Social media
      - 6,244 Facebook Likes
      - 25,782 video views for the high school video
      - 3,012 video views for the community video

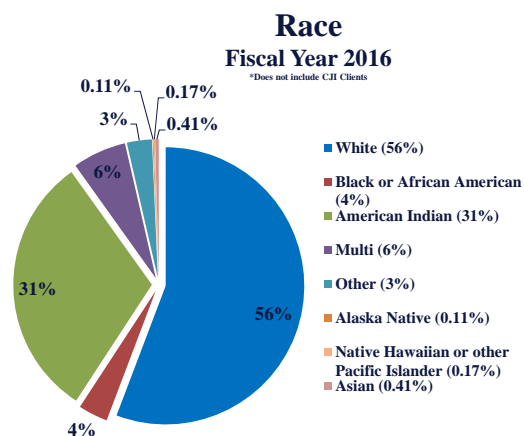
## Methamphetamine Treatment

- Individuals with a methamphetamine addiction can access an array of community-based substance use disorder services depending on their specific needs, including:
  - Outpatient Treatment Services
  - Low Intensity Residential Services (aka Halfway House)
  - Inpatient Treatment Services
  - Detox Services
- In addition, there are two Intensive Methamphetamine Treatment Programs



## Substance Use Disorder Treatment Statistics

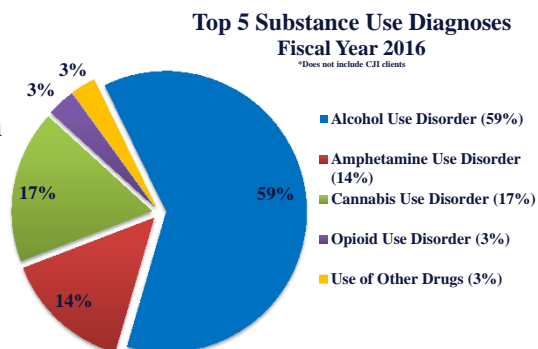
- In FY16, 31% of clients served in publically funded Substance Use Disorder Services were Native Americans



## Substance Use Disorder Treatment Statistics

- In FY16, 14% of clients served in publically funded Substance Use Disorder Services had an Amphetamine Use Disorder

- Of those with an Amphetamine Use disorder, 26% were Native American



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## Intensive Methamphetamine Treatment Expansion

- SB 43: An Act to make an appropriation to expand intensive methamphetamine treatment services within the Dept. of Social Services
- Expansion of \$603,740 in one-time funding
- With the increase in arrest rates, additional meth treatment resources are needed
- In FY15, 13% of state-funded community behavioral health clients entered treatment with a primary diagnosis of amphetamine dependence; 8% nationwide
- Expansion will support a full continuum of evidence-based meth treatment services

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## Technical Assistance from SAMHSA - Methamphetamine Treatment

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- In 2016, the Division requested technical assistance (TA) from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration (SAMHSA)
  - To assist in identifying best practices for treatment related to meth use
  - On site visits by 2 national expert consultants March 20-24, 2017
  - Follow up report forthcoming in May with potential follow up activities or training
