

Results of Environmental sanitation, Safety, Fire prevention and Accessibility Survey
350 Elk Street, Rapid City – Full Circle – Inpatient Chemical Dependency – Owned

1. A changing table and pad were noted in the north bathroom. Interview with the director revealed neither clients nor staff used a disinfectant or sanitizer on the changing pad between diaper changes. She was not aware the pad should be disinfected or sanitized between individual uses.

Corrective action taken or what plan is intended to make the correction:

The changing table has been removed from the north bathroom. Each client has been given an individual changing pad that they can use for their child, along with verbal instruction for sanitizing it.

Date when Correction was or will be made:

12/4/2017 Clients with infants are given individual changing pads.
12/8/2017 The changing table has been removed from the facility permanently.


How this area will be monitored in the future for continued compliance:

Each new client with an infant will be given a changing pad of their own and directions for sanitizing it. There is no longer a common changing table in the Full Circle residential facility.

Staff: position responsible for monitoring this area:

The Team Lead will assure we are stocked with changing pads.
The CD Techs will distribute them as needed
