Minutes:

I. Call to Order

August 13, 2015 the Behavioral Health Advisory Council meeting was called to order by Chairperson, Sara Weishaar.

II. Review and Approval of Meeting Minutes

Sara Weishaar requested the Council's review of the June 2015 meeting minutes. No proposed changes were recommended at this time.

III. New Members

Tiffany Wolfgang introduced new member, Dianna Marshall. Dianna assumes the membership role of designee for South Dakota Advocacy Services.

Tiffany also provided an overview of vacant positions and member terms.

Vacant Positions:

- A certified or licensed substance abuse provider who provides direct services at a community agency (not a center director).
- Patty Johnson – A family member of a child with SED with a preference for a family member representing a child between the ages of 5 and 12.

Tiffany requested the Council assist in seeking potential interested persons for both of the open positions. Council members were asked to email Jennifer Humphrey with names and contact information. The Division of Behavioral Health will collect names and submit them to the Governor's Office for consideration.

Member Terms

The following terms are expiring October 30, 2015:

- Tiffany Butler – Representative of an accredited prevention provider.
- Kori Kromminga – A family member of a youth with SED and co-occurring substance use.
- Belinda Nelson – Director of an accredited substance abuse provider.
- Roseann Peterson-Olson – Adult with SMI who is a member of an advocacy organization.
- Ellen Washenberger – A family member of an adult with SMI with a preference for a family member of an individual between the ages of 18 and 29.
- Sara Weishaar – A family member of a child with SED with a preference for a family member representing a child between the ages of 5 and 12.

Tiffany requested the above members interested in serving another term to contact Jennifer Humphrey. The Division of Behavioral Health will resubmit all those interested to the Governor's Office for consideration.

IV. Behavioral Health System Updates

Human Services Center (HSC)

Tiffany Wolfgang announced that a nationwide search continues in an effort to fill the Director's position once occupied by Ric Compton who resigned April 10, 2015. Amy Iversen-Pollreis is currently acting as the Interim Director.

Fiscal Reports

Stacy Bruels provided an overview of the FY 2016 budget in the areas of substance abuse and mental health services.

Data & Outcomes

Tiffany Wolfgang announced the formation of a workgroup between Behavioral Health staff and representatives from the Council of Mental Health and the Council of Alcohol and Drug Addictions. The workgroup will review all data & outcomes collected across behavioral health services. Next steps include reviewing what is mandatory to collect for Block Grant purposes; analyze how we currently use the information and address any areas that need to be modified. The intent is to develop a uniform data set that will enable DBH staff to monitor outcomes for all behavioral health services.

Travis Hallock shared a draft compilation of the following substance abuse treatment data:

- Employment at Admission and Discharge - This data is a compilation of FY 2013-2015 and reports on individuals 16 years of age and older. Clients identified as employed are considered to be working full time or part time at the time of admission or discharge.
- Reason for Discharge – This data describes the number of publically funded (contract and/or Medicaid) clients who received substance abuse services during FY 2013-2015 and the reason services were discontinued.
- Substance Use Disorders Primary Diagnosis – This data is diagnostic information for substance use disorders for inmates who were assessed upon entry into the state correctional setting, and community clients who received services funded by the Division of Behavioral Health in a community setting. The data was collected from STARS during FY2011 through FY2015 and will be monitored quarterly and reported yearly.

Administrative Rules of South Dakota (ARSD) Workgroup

Tiffany Wolfgang announced the third ARSD Workgroup meeting will be held October 29, 2015. The intent is to distribute to stakeholders a final draft of the proposed rule changes one month in advance for final feedback. The purpose of the workgroup is to ensure consistency in all mental health and substance abuse areas and reduce any unnecessary regulatory burden.

Mental Health Support Program

Tiffany Wolfgang provided an overview of the FY 2015 Mental Health Support Program client outcomes.

Juvenile Justice Reinvestment Initiative (JJRI)

Tiffany Wolfgang announced that the Division of Behavioral Health is working closely with the Unified Judicial System and the Department of Corrections in order to implement what had been determined in statute through the Juvenile Justice Reform Initiative. A Functional Family Therapy Request for Proposal (RFP) is expected to go out soon.

Travis Hallock announced the following upcoming trainings:

- National Alliance for the Mentally Ill – South Dakota (NAMI-SD) Annual Conference – October 1-2, 2015 in Huron.
- Mental Health First Aid Training – September 18, 2015 in Sioux Falls.

Block Grant

Tiffany Wolfgang reviewed with Council members the planning steps required for the FY 2016-2017 Combined Mental Health/Substance Abuse and Prevention Treatment Block Grant, which is due September 1, 2015. Priority areas identified at the last Council meeting in June 2015 included peer support services; a statewide treatment needs assessment and collection of client level data and outcomes. An update to the 5% set-aside for first episode psychosis was also reviewed during this time.

Tiffany requested Council members to contact Jennifer Humphrey at Jennifer.Humphrey@state.sd.us in order to provide additional feedback to the state plan by August 26, 2015.

Mental Health Statistics Improvement Program (MHSIP) Survey

Travis Hallock provided an overview of the 2014 MHSIP Survey Report. The report was produced by Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education, Mental Health Program. The report is available at <http://dss.sd.gov/>. All CMHCs have been provided copies with their agency’s results. Follow-up work will be done with agencies that have areas that follow below the state average.
