Fall Grant Cycle Awards

Total Applications for Funding: 12
Total Award: \$375,259.20

Primary factors contributing to successful awards:

- Budgets within or near the recommended range of the Advisory Committee.
- Strong alignment with the MOA, focusing on the stipulation that the project is using funds only for the purposes of abating and alleviating the opioid crisis and co-occurring substance abuse in South Dakota.
- Reasonable alignment of the requested budget to the number of individuals served or projected impact.
- Projects that did not duplicate other known efforts ongoing.

Prevention Initiatives		
Brookings County Youth Mentoring Program	\$15,170	Serving youth who have ACEs related to OUD in their families; funds will expand on an established model.
Emily's Hope	\$78,100	Opioid misuse prevention curriculum delivery – grades 6-12.
Michael Glynn Memorial Coalition	\$10,925	Health Fair re: opioid prevention organized and “manned” by youth.
Mitchell Technical College	\$10,829	Training for all 120+ employees in OEND and purchase of medication and co-located AED storage units.
South Dakota School of Mines & Technology	\$27,734	Expand existing prevention program with focus on opioids through additional staff time and the creation of a strategic plan. Funds to support OEND on campus and through community outreach.
Wagner Community Memorial Hospital	\$10,000	Funds to support OEND and a Health Fair at the local level.

Coteau des Prairies Hospital	\$40,450	ED staff training, additional telehealth equipment, naloxone purchase, and community training.
Minnehaha County Sheriff's Office: Jail Division	\$36,500	Funding to support equipment (monitor) purchase. Will impact jailed individuals at high risk for overdose or for medical complications from withdrawal.
Southeastern Behavioral HealthCare	\$31,800	Provide transitional housing units for up to 8 individuals in recovery for a one-year period. Strong community partnerships.
University of South Dakota - Physician Assistant Program	\$32,653	Provides training in MOUD for PAs, and a network of peers to continue to expand MOUD providers in the state.
Washed Clean Addiction and Recovery Ministries	\$17,100	The project will assist 9.5 persons in recovery to find long-term housing and faith-based services over six months at a cost of \$1,800 in support per person.
Youth & Family Services, Inc.	\$63,998	Training of 7 staff on opioids and how to work with youth who have trauma related to parents with OUD.
