**96,451 MINUTES**

There were 96,451 minutes of professional development viewed through the Crisis Speaker Series delivered via Panopto in the 2022-2023 school year. These videos were accessed by teachers, paraprofessionals, school mental health providers, and school administrators across the state.

**9 EXPERTS**

The virtual crisis speaker series featured top researchers and those with lived experiences on a variety of topics including student mental health, suicide prevention and response, bullying, school violence, cultivating relationships, working with difficult parents, and building resiliency.



**15 Trainers**

South Dakota has 15 individuals who have completed the Train the Trainer requirements to be certified PREPaRE Workshop instructors. The trainers are approved to teach Workshop 1, Workshop 2, or both. The trainers are located all across the state.

**502**

502 individuals have been trained in PREPaRE Workshop 1. This workshop focuses on the critical components needed to develop, exercise, and evaluate school safety teams and crisis plans.



**419**

419 individuals have been trained in PREPaRE Workshop 2. This workshop focuses on developing the knowledge and skills required to provide immediate mental health crisis interventions to students and staff who have been exposed to a traumatic stressor impacting the school community.

**121+**

121+ South Dakota School Districts have been represented at PREPaRE Trainings. These districts have had at least one employee attend Workshop 1, Workshop 2, or both.
