South Dakota's ECE programs offer a systematic approach to providing early childhood and school-age education services and technical assistance. Services are available to all child care and after-school providers, parents and others involved in the day-to-day care of children and youth.

The Early Childhood Enrichment (ECE) offices across the state deliver a variety of services focused on parents, family child care providers, childcare center staff, youth development professionals and other early education professionals throughout South Dakota.


In order to help parents, childcare providers and others promote the importance of providing a safe, healthy and caring environment for children, the SD ECE System works with both regulated and unregulated childcare programs.

### **Regulated Programs**

There are four types of regulated (state registered and licensed) programs.

- 1. Registered Family Day Care
  - Provide care and supervision of children from more than one unrelated family, in a family home, on a regular basis for part of a day as a supplement to regular parental care, without transfer of legal custody or placement for adoption.
  - Up to 12 children in care
- 2. Licensed Group Family Day Care Homes
  - Provide group care and supervision of children on a regular basis for part of a day as a supplement to regular parental care, with or without compensation, including children under the age of six living in the home and children from more than one unrelated family received for day care, in any facility, including a family home.
  - Up to 13-20 children in care
- 3. Licensed Day Care Center
  - Provide group care and supervision of children on a regular basis for part of a day as a supplement to regular parental care, with or without compensation, including children under the age of six living in the home and children from more than one unrelated family received for care in any facility, including a family home.
  - 21 or more children in care
- 4. Licensed Before and After School Program
  - Provide care and supervision of children on a regular basis before and after regular school hours.

The graph below represents the number and type of childcare providers registered with the state of South Dakota, as of 12/31/2022.



### **CLIENTS SERVED**

#### In Home and Informal Providers

Informal or in-home providers are exempt from being registered or licensed, but they can receive child care assistance payments for the one family in care, if they meet the minimum standards set by the state and federal government. These standards, that help ensure children's safety, include training, a background check, meeting health and safety standards, and an annual inspection of the home to ensure compliance with health and safety standards.

#### **State Unregulated Providers**

There are two programs operating in the state that are not required to be regulated.

- 1. Unregulated family day care (up to 12 children in care)
  - 2. Relative child care providers

Unregulated Family Day Care providers have the option of being registered with the department but are not able to receive child care assistance payments or other federal funds unless they become state registered. Unregulated providers are not required to meet any federal or state standards.


Relative providers care only for children they are related to. Federal and state regulations exempt these relative providers from licensing meaning they can receive child care assistance payments even though they are not required to meet training or other regulations. Families choosing relative care tend to know that type of provider better than a non-relative, and typically have more information about the provider to make informed choices.

#### **Regional Classes**


The Early Childhood Enrichment (ECE) System offers a variety of evidence and research-based professional development opportunities. Training is accessible to childcare providers across the state through in-person, online, and on-site delivery. Training is offered not only to meet licensing and registration requirements but to also improve the quality of care.



### **Total ECE Statewide Trainings Offered**

Statewide professional development opportunities are offered to childcare professionals and youth development professionals annually; Family Childcare, Preschool, Management/Leadership, Infant Toddler and Out of School Time.


Trainings are categorized into one of the following core competency areas; Business & Management, Communication & Relationships, Curriculum, Environment, Growth & Development, Guidance & Discipline, Health & Safety, Parent Relationships or Responsive Caregiving.



## **CHILDCARE EDUCATION**

### Child Development Associate (CDA)

The CDA credential is a nationally recognized early childhood professional credential administered by the Council for Professional Recognition. Providers who pursue the CDA credential learn to demonstrate their ability to nurture young children's physical, social, emotional and intellectual growth. CDA candidates may choose to complete the credentialing procedures for the following endorsements:



### Vision and/or Hearing Screenings


Offered through support from their local United Way agencies, Region 1 and Region 4 also provide Vision and Hearing Screenings to children enrolled in state registered or licensed childcare programs.

- Region 1 completed 336 screenings.
- Region 4 completed 318 screenings.
- \* Other regional offices provide referrals to these services through other community agencies

#### fitCare

The fitCare program was developed through a partnership between the South Dakota Department of Health, South Dakota Department of Social Services, Sanford Children's and the Sanford fit Initiative.

fitCare provides participants with education and support to identify best practice to support a child's development of healthy lifestyle habits and to plan for program improvements when needed.



### Out-of-School (OST) Credential

Youth Development Professionals working in programs serving school-age children may enroll in the South Dakota Out-of-School Time (OST) Credential training program. The SD OST Credential is a state-administered professional credential, modeled after the Child Development Associate (CDA) credential.

### South Dakota Orientation to Childcare – Level I


All new childcare providers, newly hired staff members or volunteers working in a registered or licensed childcare program are required to complete orientation training within 90 days of hire. To provide better access to child care providers, the Orientation Trainings are available online, ondemand. These trainings provide an overview on the topics of:

- 1. Prevention and Control of Infectious Diseases
- 2. Safe Sleep Practices and Reducing the Risk of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome
- 3. Administration of Medications in Childcare
- 4. Prevention and Response to Emergencies Due to Food and Allergic Reactions
- 5. Building and Physical Premises Safety
- 6. Prevention of Shaken Baby Syndrome and Abusive Head Trauma
- 7. Emergency Preparedness and Response Planning
- 8. Handling and Storage of Hazardous Materials and Bio Contaminants
- 9. Appropriate Precautions in Transporting Children
- 10. Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse and Neglect
- 11. Child Development
- 12. Pediatric First Aid
- 13. CPR

### South Dakota Orientation to Childcare – Level II

The Level II online, on-demand series meets ongoing training requirements for staff working in state licensed and registered childcare programs who have completed the Level I SD Orientation to Childcare training series. The Level II training is to be taken within 5 years of employment or Level I orientation training as long as it was taken within the first 90 days of employment. Classes in the Level II Training briefly review content from the 11 topic areas covered in the Level 1 SD Orientation or Classes as well as taking a deeper look into each area. CPR certification is offered separately at the local ECE offices.

- 3350 providers accessed Level I training.
- 1073 providers accessed Level II training.




## CHILDCARE COACHING & TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

### **Coaching & Technical Assistance**

All Technical Assistance (TA) is focused on increasing the knowledge and confidence of the provider to promote and support optimal development for every child. Social development and emotional development is critical for optimal development and is a major component of all Technical Assistance programs.

TA is offered through consultation and coaching which provides support, education, and resources. Our educators assist providers in understanding and developing the capacity of each child to form close and secure adult and peer relationships; experience, regulate, and express emotions in socially and culturally appropriate ways; and explore the environment and learn. The ECE System also provides Technical Assistance (TA) to childcare providers. TA is a multi-level process, which offers a range of assistance that includes consultation, coaching, modeling, observation, and support. TA strengthens the quality of care for young children.




### **PARENT EDUCATION & RESOURCES**


Distributions are coordinated with 69 community partner agencies in 45 counties across the state to support families' child seat needs.


### **Responsive Parenting**

ECE regions continually collaborate to best serve the childcare providers and Out of School Time (OST) programs in South Dakota. Beyond training and technical assistance, the regions were able to provide additional resources and supports for childcare providers and OST programs in multiple settings and across all age groups.

#### Statewide Promotion and Improvement Efforts:

- Hosted Director Lunch and Learn Sessions.

- Support and promote evidence-based early learning and care through quality standards and professional development.
- Enhance communication and consumer education tools and support to elevate the field of child care and youth development.
- Develop tools and utilize data to improve administrative efficiency, support decision0making, and enhance family and provider experiences.
- Promote targeted strategies that promote recruitment and retention for our states child care and youth development workforce.

### Statewide Program Improvements in 2023:

- CDA Curriculum. Launch of revised CDA (Child Development Associates) curriculum.
- fit Kits. Provided Resource kits for fitCare to Registered and Licensed providers.
- **Promotional Booths.** Regions will be having booths at various conferences, to promote the Regional and Statewide ECE Services.
- South Dakota 360 Program. Program is developed with a partnership between South Dakota Office of Licensing and Accreditation and the ECE programs. The goal of the SD 360 Program is to build a positive, strong relationship between the childcare program directors, SD ECE Programs and the SD Office of Licensing and Accreditation.
- Statewide QRIS Classes. In 2023, the QRIS classes will be available as 'on demand', which will allow providers to access the training and receive credit at their convenience.
- Supporting Environmental Rating Scales (ERS) Observations throughout the state.

### Statewide Specialty Trainings in 2023:

- Partnered with Worthy Well Empowered to offer the following trainings:
  - Community Resiliency Model: Trauma Informed Care and Mental Wellness (Part 1 of 2). Providers' mental well-being is the most critical component to nurturing, traumainformed care. Join us in learning about the Community Resiliency Model: how stress and trauma affect our bodies, how to support ourselves in times of stress, and the first of 6 CRM skills to get us back into our Resilient Zones!
  - **Community Resiliency Model: Mental Wellness with CRM Skills (Part 2 of 2).** Continue diving into the six CRM skills of how to get back to a place of wellbeing so that providers bring their best self to work and to all aspects of their life. When we have a common language around mental wellness skills, we can help ourselves, our coworkers, and the children in our care. Leave with a plan of growing their resiliency professionally, with all ages of children in their care, and in the agency.
  - Resiliency Training for Childcare Providers. Childcare providers have the opportunity to engage and practice the six wellness skills of the Community Resiliency Model. These trainings by empower providers to strengthen their mental wellbeing in 3-hour and 6 hour interactive sessions. creating a common language for wellness across provider workforce.

- Using Books for Infant & Toddler Social Emotional Development. Infants and toddlers have lots of big feelings! In this class, you will receive high-quality books and book nooks which have hands-on activities to support infant and toddler social and emotional skill building.
