

TCP Grant Decision Tool 2019-2020

The South Dakota Tobacco Control Program offers two funding opportunities on similar grant cycles, the [Community/School Partnership Grant](#) and the [Tobacco Disparities Grant](#). This tool is intended to assist potential applicants in deciding which funding opportunity best fits their chosen tobacco prevention and cessation activities. Please note that Lifeskills and NOT programming are not included in either of these funding opportunities. Only non-school entities may apply for TATU programming through the Disparities Grant at this time.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Purpose: to link school and community tobacco prevention and control efforts in order to achieve maximum impact • \$25,000 funding max • Applications open in April • 13 grantees in previous funding cycle • Focus on local communities and schools • Work plan activities required in each of the four Tobacco Control State Plan goal areas • Provides extensive guidance in activity selection using evidence-based strategies • Coverage area tends to be city or county • Must be led by both community and school representatives • Direct impact on communities and schools • Large focus on implementing school- and community-based tobacco control policies • Scoring: most weight given to work plan, budget & policy • Grant Coordinator: Regional Tobacco Prevention Coordinators • Grant contract with Regional Coordinator (VOA, BHSSC) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Purpose: to promote long-term change aimed at reducing disparate tobacco use among the SD TCP priority populations • \$25,000 funding max, \$5,000 minimum • Applications open in February • 12 grantees in previous funding cycle • Focus on TCP priority populations • Work plan activities required in at least one of the following categories: Prevention, Cessation and Secondhand Smoke • Encourages individualized work plans using evidence-based practices and techniques • Coverage area can be from organization level to statewide • Can be led by a single organization or coalition • Direct impact on TCP priority populations • Large focus on population-specific education, policies and interventions • Scoring: most weight given to budget and activity narrative • Grant Coordinator: Tobacco Disparities Coordinator • Grant contract with the State of South Dakota
