RE: Substance Use Disorder (SUD) Treatment Coverage for Adults

Effective July 1, 2018, South Dakota Medicaid covers substance use disorder (SUD) treatment services for eligible adults. Prior coverage was limited to children under age 21 and pregnant women.

Covered levels of care for SUD treatment include:

- The integrated assessment;
- Crisis intervention services;
- Outpatient treatment programs;
- Intensive outpatient treatment programs;
- Day treatment programs;
- Clinically-managed low-intensity residential treatment programs;
- Medically-monitored intensive inpatient treatment programs; and
- Psychiatric residential treatment programs for substance use disorders;

SUD treatment providers must be accredited by the Division of Behavioral Health and enrolled with South Dakota Medicaid.
